

RUDDY-SHENKMAN HOSPICE

Providing a live-in space for hospice patients in the west end of Ottawa is the dream behind Hein House, the residential wing of the Ruddy-Shenkman Hospice in Kanata.

In June 2013 Hospice Care Ottawa purchased 110 McCurdy Drive, a 3.6 acre property located in Central Kanata. In 2014 they opened their doors to the Ruddy-Shenkman Hospice and began offering community hospice programs, such as day hospice, grief and bereavement groups, caregiver support and volunteer training.

Hein House's convenient location in Kanata will make it much easier for families and friends living in the west end to spend time with a loved one staying at the residence. The 12,592-square-foot addition will allow 10 residents to receive 24-hour hospice care and two residents to receive short-term respite care. In each of the suites, residents and their families will have the privacy of their own bathroom and access to the gardens. Families have space to stay overnight with their loved ones and many beautiful quiet places to rest and refresh.

FUNDRAISING CAMPAIGN FOR HOSPICE CARE OTTAWA

Hospice Care Ottawa is a community-based charitable organization. They offer palliative and end-of-life services at no cost to people living in the city of Ottawa. Delivery of services is made possible through the support of a small dedicated staff, many volunteers and generous donors.

Hospice Care Ottawa Mission

To accompany and support individuals and their families through their end-of-life journey by providing compassionate high quality care.

Hospice Care Ottawa Vision

To be part of a dedicated, caring community where individuals and their families have access to compassionate, high quality end-of-life care when and where needed.

Hospice Care Ottawa Values

Compassion and respect guide all of their actions and decision-making. They are inspired by the courage and strength of those they serve. Hospice Care Ottawa Services

Hospice Care Ottawa provides the following services, at no charge, to people and their families living with life-threatening illness:

- **Residential Hospice Care:** 24-hr nursing care in a home-like environment for those in the last days to weeks of life.
- **Day Hospice:** a day-away at one of our hospice sites, for people to enjoy camaraderie, good food, nursing support and Complementary Therapies.
- **In-Home Support:** volunteer visiting to people living at home provides practical support, reassurance and comfort.
- **Caregiver Support:** support and respite services for those caring for a loved one.
- **Bereavement Care:** individual and group support, nature walks and retreats for those coping with the loss of a loved one.
